## **English for Communication and Soft Skills**

## **Preamble:**

## **Objectives:**

- to enhance the candidate's ability to understand the dynamics of social interaction.

## Level I – First Year

### **Teaching Grammar:**

Kinds of sentences, Reported speech, Modals and auxiliary verbs, Tenses, Phrasal verbs, Idioms, Active and Passive Voice, Degrees of Comparison: Positive, Comparative and Superlative, Simple, Compound and Complex sentences.

## Level II - Second Year

#### **Listening and Speaking Skills:**

Accent Neutralization, consonants and vowel sounds, Syllables, Intonation, Phonetic symbols and Pronunciation, Dialogues/ Conversations, Presentation skills, Conferences, Seminars, Public Speaking, Interviews, and Group discussions.

### **Level III – Third Year**

#### **Reading and Writing Skills:**

Styles of Reading: Excerpts or Passages from famous literary texts (Drama, Novel, Fiction, Short Story, Prose, Poetry and Essay). Precis, Dialogue writing, Resume writing, and Comprehension passages, Story writing, Report writing, Note-making, Letters: Formal and Informal letters.
